PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I hope that all Historical Society members enjoyed the beautiful summer weather. There was more rain than usual but that ended the severe draught. At the same time, it made the need for a new roof at the Huguenot House all the more important. Rain seeped into the attic where the roof was not patched and we tried our best to catch and empty the water from plastic tubs. The good news is we are now in the process of submitting a grant application to the SBM Charitable Foundation. If successful, we will then apply for a grant with the Connecticut Trust for Historic Preservation. This will require a matching amount paid by the Historical Society, if approved.

On the Connecticut Trails day weekend in June, the educational walk we sponsored met with good reviews, however because of the threat of rain, it was not very well attended. Saturday, June 10th where we once again participated in Connecticut Open House Day, this event was successful in attendance and in donations received. We appreciate all of the help from the East Hartford Garden Club who donated proceeds from plant sales and from generous donations from some Historical Society members. Our museum buildings at Martin Park were open for eight consecutive Sunday afternoons during July and August, however, we did not have that many visitors looking for free guided tours.

To help out with fundraising for the roof replacement, we've also reserved several groups and tour bus visits in September and October. We must have help from Historical Society volunteers to make this successful. Although some of these dates and times are subject to change, please note on your calendars as follows: Sunday, September 17th from 10:30 to 12:30pm; Monday, October 9th from 1:00 to 3:00pm; Thursday, October 19th from 1:15 to 3:15pm; and Sunday, October 22nd from 10:00 to 12:00pm. We are also having a fundraising event on September 28th at Hartford Fine Art & Framing, 80 Pitkin Street in East Hartford between 6 and 8pm. This will be a photography and memorabilia exhibition called "Greater Hartford and the Great War: World War I" A flyer for this event is enclosed in the newsletter.

The September 20, 2017 Historical Society annual dinner meeting will again be held in the First Congregational Church, 837 Main Street at Church Corners. Another fabulous buffet style dinner catered by Matt Becker of Becker's Catering awaits those who attend. The full menu appears in the newsletter. Following our annual dinner, there will be a short business meeting that includes the election of officers for the upcoming year and then we will have our September program.

“THE SINKING OF THE RMS LUSITANIA” ANNUAL DINNER PROGRAM

Jason Scappaticci will be our guest speaker for the Historical Society’s Annual Membership Dinner. Jason will join us for the traditional Turkey and Ham supper at the First Congregational Church on the evening of Thursday, September 20, 2017 to share another documentary/program with us.

Mr. Scappaticci will be remembered from his lecture last year about the 1964-1965 New York World’s Fair. Jason is currently the Director of Transitional Programs at MCC and he serves on the Manchester Board of Education. We welcome him back for another informative evening.

His PowerPoint Presentation this month will center upon a World War I event: “The Sinking of the RMS Lusitania”. This British-made cruise ship of the Cunard Line was torpedoed by a German U-Boat off the coast of Ireland on May 7, 1915 - more than 100 years ago. This incident outraged the American public. 128 United States citizens, including men, women and children who were sailing from New York City to England, lost their lives. This action on the part of the



Imperial German Navy hastened President Woodrow Wilson's decision to enter the conflict, known afterward as, "The Great War".



AN UPDATE FROM THE HSEH COLLECTIONS COMMITTEE


A group of us have been working an average of 20-30- hours a week since winter to bring the collection up to date by working on the inventory, identification and organizing all our collection. The rooms in the Brewer House have been cleaned up and pieces rearranged so that they are now organized in like groupings. We still have a long way to go but we are making progress!

As the computer inventory grows, so does our knowledge of East Hartford's history. From dishes and dolls, post cards, photos, letters, deeds boxes and books, along with quilts and lovely old clothes, we have found many treasures.

Finding old photos with the actual names written on the backs is a rare find. Unfortunately, most of the oldest of our photo collection remains unnamed. Below are a few examples of some old 19th century photos in our collection. If anyone is familiar with the families of Brewer, Hills, Treat or Goodwin, just to name a few, by all means please consider visiting with us and taking a look.
